

Did you know?

Over the last five years, Calgary has averaged 63 snow days, and 162 centimetres of snowfall.



During the first 24 hours after snowfall, City plows focus on **over 4000 lane kilometres** of high-volume roadway. If you laid this road out into a single lane, it would take you all the way to Quebec City!

Did you know?

The City uses a sand/salt mix called Pickle? We adjust the mix based on the temperature? Why? When its colder (below -10°C) salt doesn't work anymore, so we grit the road instead!

> Bridges are typically colder than other roads during the winter. It's important to drive carefully over bridges in the winter!

Did you know?

Plows spread our pickle (salt/sand mixture) directly on the road.



Walking like a penguin can keep you safe on an icy patch? Try walking like a penguin (small steps) to keep yourself upright!

Did you know?

That you can be a snow angel in the winter? Consider helping a neighbour clear their sidewalk of snow! Remember to try and pile the snow on the lawn, and not shovel it back into the roadway.

Did you know?

That our plows push snow to the side of the road during the winter?

It's important to keep an eye on the road and sidewalks when you're playing in the winter to keep yourself safe, especially when that snow starts to pile up!
