


Section A - 33rd Avenue SW, with Curb Extension Scale 1:100 (Horizontal), 1:50 (Vertical - road), 1:100 (Features)

Design Elements:

1 Multi-Use Path (MUP)


- Physically separated infrastructure for all ages and abilities of people to walk and wheel in Marda Loop.
- 2 Pedestrian Rest Areas
- Seating and landscaping provides an inviting place to rest and socialize within Marda Loop.
- **3** Connection to MAX Yellow BRT Plaza

• Supports multi-modal access to and from Marda Loop for residents and visitors. 4 Publicly Accessible Gathering Spaces

 Publicly accessible pedestrian gathering and event areas, subject to further collaboration with adjacent landowners.

5 Streetcar Plaza

 Historically inspired community gathering space adjacent to unique local businesses will help to activate the precinct and support continued business vitality.

6 Maximize On Street Parking Supply

 Selection of a multi-use pathway provides road right of way space to accommodate on street parking on both sides of the corridor.

7 Truck Aprons

• Slows the speed of travel for turning motor vehicles, improving comfort and safety for people on crosswalks.


8 Marda Loop Gateway Features

 Strategically placed theming and branding elements, and landscape nodes that help foster the site character to create a sense of place and community identity for the residents and visitors.


9 Enhanced Landscape Features

Increased planting and canopy for pedestrian comfort and climate resiliency.

- 10 Bikeway Switchback and Plaza
- Places priority on accessibility and comfort for wheeling users.
- 11 Connection to Pedestrian Overpass
- Supports multi-modal access to and from Killarney, Currie, and **Richmond-Knob Hill.**
- 12 Enhanced Transit Stop
- Shelter provides a comfortable space for people to wait.
- 13 Protected Wheeling Lanes
- Separated lanes are more comfortable for all ages and abilities of people wheeling on 20th Street SW.
- 14 Festival Space
- Enhanced finishin with pavers fosters a unique experience for markets and activities in the Marda Loop area.



Section D - 34th Avenue SW, East of 20th Street Scale 1:100 (Horizontal), 1:50 (Vertical - road), 1:100 (Features)







