


White Goose Flying Report

The City of Calgary's Response to the Calls to Action

Call to Action #82

We call upon provincial and territorial governments, in collaboration with Survivors and their organizations, and other parties to the Settlement Agreement, to commission and install a publicly accessible, highly visible, Residential Schools Monument in each capital city to honour Survivors and all the children who were lost to their families and communities.

Put up in honour of the first 215 children discovered at Tk'emlups te Secwépemc First Nation (Kamloops) May 27, 2021






Project Timeline

City Announced \$1,000,000 to be dedicated to establishing a permanent IRS memorial in Calgary November 2021	Establish an Elder's Advisory Circle November 2021	Establish a Working Group November 2021	Create a Project Charter March 2022	Scope out Feasible Park Spaces March 2022	Create an Engagement Plan April 2022



Project Timeline Continued



- Hire Indigenous Landscape Architect after 1st Community Engagements
- Construction to start Summer 2023
- Project completion Q4, 2024 with the opening of the IRS Permanent Memorial Site



Parameters

- Must be accessible
- Must be inclusive
- Must include the spirit of the temporary memorial
- Safe place to grieve
- Design & Location ideas obtained from conversations with the Indigenous community

Indian Residential School Memorial... Statue?

Dignity of Earth and Sky

- Three years to build
- Cost 1,000,000 US dollars
 - After Engagement, we will have \$0.9MM CAD
- Stainless steel, 50-foot-tall statue was specifically designed by sculptor Dale Lamphere to honor the cultures of the Lakota and Dakota people.
- Do people prefer a large statue to commemorate?



Indian Residential Memorial... Gathering Space?

- Kwanlin Dun Cultural Center
- Whitehorse, Yukon
- When this fire is lit, community members know that they can come, speak and be heard
 - Sacred Fire

The Journey to Freedom Park

The Vietnamese Boat People memorial

- Cost: ~\$1.5MM
 - Vietnamese Canada Association fund-raised \$0.2MM; CoC gave \$1MM
 - The Province chipped in \$0.3MM
- Time:
 - \$1MM awarded by CoC in 2020
 - Opening ceremony: July 1st, 2022

This is the 'centerpiece' of the Reconciliation Garden that they are hoping to unveil in April 2023

- Reflects First-Nations, Metis and Inuit in Alberta
- The statue is a Mother holding an Infant "representing Mother Earth caring for humanity"





Engagement Details

- September December 2022
- Urban and surrounding Nation's engagements
- Engagements will be held virtual and in person
- Engagements will be held at community agencies
- Engagements will be held during lunch and at night if needed
- Engagements will be held on the weekends if needed
- About three hours long (but can adapt time to 1.5 hours where needed)
- 15-25 participants ideally (but will adapt)
