Nabeell has cerebral palsy and uses a power wheelchair to get around the city. When Nabeel goes anywhere, he usually spends a day planning exactly how he'll interact with the space he's visiting. Knowing the best place to get dropped off, if there are accessible bathrooms available and whether there's an elevator nearby is incredibly important. Nabeell says that planning a day out in the city creates a lot of anxiety before time.

Caroline is 33 and is experiencing homelessness due to mental health problems She left her job because of feeling unwell. Since then she has been sleeping at a shelter during the nights and getting access to help and services in the daytime. Caroline loves the park as she is welcomed there but has found it difficult to be in other spaces where people might be judging her or she is not welcomed.

Kim is a parent who has three young children, ages 8, 6, and 2. Kim makes a point to get out with them each day. The two youngest kids ride in a stroller while the oldest walks. Kim enjoys going on adventures to new spaces that feel welcoming for adults and kids. Kim looks for urban spaces where younger children will be safe and have lots to do and see.

Profile: Maxemed	What does this person NOTICE in the park?
Maxemed is 30 years old and just moved to Calgary from Mogadishu, Somalia. He wished to provide a better future for his family. There have been many challenges since arriving, such as finding affordable housing, leaving behind all his extended family and friends, learning the English language and adapting to Canadian culture in order to succeed in a new job, communicate with colleagues and build new relationships.

Profile: Emma		What does this person NOTICE in the park?
Emma is 16 years old and loves to hang out with friends in the community. One barrier is that she does not have a lot of spending money so the places she goes to have to be free. At times she feels unsafe or unwelcomed in spaces which make it uncomfortable for her and her friends to be. When her and her friends are out they enjoy spaces that they can share with friends, family, and strangers. Emma especially enjoys being able to sit around, to relax, to chat, play, practice group sports, or just walk and hang out with friends.

Profile: Leila	What does this person NOTICE in the park?
Leila is dealing with vision loss but is able to live a very independent lifestyle.  Leila, like most people who are legally blind or deal with other vision conditions, has some degree of sight. She relies partially on her sight, so some visual cues can be used particularly when the signs use Braille and are large and contrasting in colour. Leila also uses textures and audible signals to navigate the world, so increasing the use of these elements can help make a space easier to get around.
