






East Village 2008







Calgary's Greater Downtown Plan is an opportunity to reinvigorate a commitment to success in Greater Downtown and align with new initiatives underway.


The **OBJECTIVES** of this new Plan are to:


- 1. Reinforce the value of mixed-use neighbourhoods

- 6. Shift the image of the Downtown Core













Grow the green infrastructure network


- 1. Plan, expand and connect to the Green Network

- 5. Support the Plus 15 Network








Enable public transit as a preferred mobility choice




Bring Courthouse Park to Life

- Program park with The Core and CDA (think Fashion Week)
- Close lanes to expand public realm for food and beverage.
- Investigate active use for Courthouse

- Access to LRT
- Light Heritage Buildings (Courthouse and Knox)
- Involve SAIT
- Give destination use to new Boutique Hotel
- Incent a major mixeduse development

Using parks tools and assets to create community and destinations





Example – Alternatives for parks operations & activation

Some of the following approaches could be considered:

- The activation of parks through a range of programming initiatives.
- Partnerships with businesses and a neighbourhood-level residential population for downtown park stewardship (including and re-thinking volunteerism).

- Alternative mechanisms of park administration and fee-based use.
- The creation of new smaller vibrant publicly accessible neighbourhood parks that support community need first.


Climate and our Downtown



- Reducing emissions from buildings and decreasing maintenance costs
- Increasing investment in building retrofits
- Aiming for Net Zero
- Decreasing climate risk

Climate and our Downtown





Example: Net Zero Emissions

Proposed Actions:

- 1. Implement an Energy Performance Standard for new buildings and major renovations to existing buildings in the Greater Downtown. Over time increase the stringency of the standard to eventually require buildings to have net zero emissions by 2050.
- 2. Develop a program for deep energy retrofits of existing buildings to achieve net zero emissions by 2050 or a minimum GHG emissions reduction of 80 per cent below 2005 levels.

- Rescope Project to prepare a NEW Plan (initiative of the Downtown Strategy) 2019 Q3
- Calgary Planning Commission Closed Workshop March 19, 2020
- Formed a manager Steering Committee July 2020
- Rescope Project September 2020
- Drafting Calgary's Greater Downtown Plan
- Planning and Urban Development Committee (PUD) April 2021
- Council May 2021
