#### **Project overview**

As part of the West Hillhurst Streetscape and Public Realm Improvements Project, we are looking to make a series of community-level improvements within your community. Results from Phase 1 engagement will help us inform a list of potential projects for you to help prioritize during Phase 2 engagement.

This project is part of the <u>Established Areas Growth and Change Strategy</u>, a program that provides funding to support short-term (1-3 years) public realm improvement projects in established communities where growth and change are happening.

We asked you to let us know more about what you would like to see in your community by identifying potential improvements in the following six categories:

- Walking: where you would like improvements to walkability and walking connections
- Biking and Wheeling: where you would like an improved biking or wheeling connection
- Park Space: where you would like to see a park, or where you would like improvements to an
  existing park
- Gathering Place: where you would like a place to hang out with friends and family
- Business Access: where you would like improved access to businesses
- Traffic: where you would like to improve a traffic issue

#### **Engagement overview**

This phase of engagement is the first of four planned phases. This initial phase was designed to:

- Inform the public about the project; and
- Identify community-level improvements within West Hillhurst.

Given physical distancing considerations due to COVID-19, all engagement in this phase was completed online. Online feedback for this phase of engagement was open from March 26 to April 26, 2021.

#### What we asked

Using the mapping function on the City's Engage Portal, respondents were asked to let us know more about what they would like to see in their community by identifying potential improvements in the following six categories:

- Walking: where you would like improvements to walkability and walking connections
- Traffic: where you would like to improve a traffic issue
- Biking and Wheeling: where you would like an improved biking or wheeling connection
- Park Space: where you would like to see a park, or where you would like improvements to an
  existing park
- Gathering Place: where you would like a place to hang out with friends and family
- Business Access: where you would like improved access to businesses

Responses that fell within the communities of Hillhurst and Sunnyside were shared with the Hillhurst-Sunnyside Streetscape and Public Realm Improvements Project team.

In total, 308 individual comments were submitted. By category, the number of responses were:

#### What we heard

The themes outlined in this section represent those that were most mentioned by respondents and weighted accordingly. All written comments have been reviewed by the project team and have been included in the <u>Verbatim Comments</u> section of this report.

Several key themes and areas of opportunity emerged from our engagement in Phase One:

#### Walking:

- **Safety:** respondents shared concerns around the interface between motorized vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians.
- Crosswalks: respondents shared concerns around the ability to cross roadways. Sight lines and excessive speed were noted most often in the comments
- **Sidewalks:** respondents indicated that sidewalks in the area need to be upgraded; specifically, width and proximity to traffic were noted.
- Other themes mentioned:
  - Lighting concerns
  - Pathway Improvements
  - Pedestrian bridge over the Bow River
  - Sound Barriers

#### Traffic:

- Safety: speeding, congestion, and driver behavior were areas of concern.
- **Calming Measures:** respondents shared several locations where traffic calming measure would benefit the community.
- Other themes mentioned:
  - Road resurfacing
  - Short cutting through communities
  - Congestion

#### Biking and Wheeling:

- Protected bike lanes: respondents indicated that both improvement to, and expansion of
  protected bike lanes in the community would improve the pedestrian, cyclist, motorized
  traffic interface.
- **Safety:** respondents reported that there are several intersections where pedestrians, cyclists and motorized vehicles come into conflict.
- **Traffic Controls:** respondents reported locations where improved traffic controls would help to minimize pedestrian, cyclist and motorized vehicle conflicts.

#### **Summary of Input**

Below is a summary of the main themes that were most prevalent in the comments received for each question from online engagement. Each theme includes summary examples of verbatim comments, with the exact words used. To ensure transparency, verbatim comments have not been altered. In some cases, we may have used only a portion of the comment that spoke to a particular theme. Although the identified points of interest were spread across the community, specific clustered areas were also identified. These clusters tended to be along the main transit corridors through the community. Example comments were identified as being reflective of the theme being discussed.


